**INSTRUCTIONS FOR YOUR IV SEDATION**

Payment for surgery is expected upon checking in, unless other payment arrangements have been made in advance.

1. **DO NOT** eat or drink anything after midnight the night before surgery unless instructed to do so by your doctor. It is very important that this rule be followed and if it is not complied with, *the surgery may be cancelled*. **You can brush your teeth, just be cautious on the amount of water you swallow.**
2. **Regarding smoking:** The tobacco in your bloodstream causes problems with both the sedation technique and post –operatively during the healing process. Please refrain from smoking **TWO** days prior to and **SEVEN** days after surgery.
3. If you are concerned with your past or present medical history, please consult with your doctor about these concerns **BEFORE** surgery.
4. Try to have a restful morning before surgery.
5. If you are taking medications daily, please consult your surgeon or your family physician to evaluate if you may delay taking those medications. Please let your surgeon know at least one day prior to your appointment. If you are taking high blood pressure medication or antibiotics for Mitral Valve Prolapse – take your medications as you would every morning, even the morning of surgery.
6. **DO NOT** wear lipstick, fingernail polish, or a fake fingernail on your right hand index finger. Please leave all personal items with the responsible party. Also wear a *short sleeve shirt* for surgery and use the restroom prior to surgery.
7. **DO NOT** wear contact lenses; they must be removed prior to surgery. Take them out at home the morning of surgery. We do not have any solution or cases to store them for you.
